

Before you make an application make sure you read the application form carefully. It has important information you need to be aware of.

- Insurance- You will need Public Liability Insurance of \$20 million (except hobbyist stall holders) Please send through a certificate of currency by return email with your form. Please read the application form for more information
- Invoices- If applicable we will send you an invoice after your form is received
- **Electricity Requirements-** You must make your electricity requirements known on the form to ensure everything is set up correctly on the day. Please ensure this includes if you require a 10amp or 15amp plug and the number of points
- Food Stall Holders- We ask that all food stall holders be on site mid-afternoon on Friday (if you'd like to come earlier that's fine). Were also expecting a big day on Saturday with a number of big events on Saturday night so we ask that you stay set up as long as possible on Saturday night, preferably to the close of the show

Electrical Equipment and Power Leads

Any Exhibitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the showground are required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers, and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a qualified electrical tagger. Any exhibitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the showground.

Please check all your electrical equipment and leads before you come to the showground.

The Appeals Committee will consist of the president, the chief steward from whichever section the appeal originates and one adjudicator, being one of the following: Greg Tyler, Rob Perkins or Tammy McCoy.

- An appeal must be lodged by the plaintiff with the chief steward of the section concerned within thirty minutes of the announcement of completion of the class judging.
- The appeal must be in writing and accompanied by \$50, which will be refunded if the appeal is upheld. If the appeal is lost, the Society will retain the fee.

Section 1: Horses

Rules and Regulations

- 1. We strongly recommend that all horses are vaccinated for Hendra Virus.
- 2. Entry Fee: Open \$5, Junior \$5, (unless otherwise stated), payable at the ring office on the day of the Show, or on ShowDay online before the show. There is NO REFUND available.
- 3. Prize money: All prize money in Section 1 will be paid by the secretary in the ring office, after the Grand Parade on Saturday. (Please note all competitors must enter the Grand Parade Grand Parade is at 2pm Saturday afternoon.) Prize money not claimed by 3 pm on the second day of the Show may be forfeited. Four entries in a Class are needed before 2nd and 3rd prizes are paid. A Pair's prize money is divided.
- 4. Ridden Class Prize Money: 1st \$10, 2nd \$8, 3rd -\$5.

Led Class Prize Money: 1st - \$10, 2nd - \$8, 3rd - \$5.

Junior Class Prize Money: 1st - \$10, 2nd - \$8, 3rd - \$5, unless otherwise stated.

Showjumping: Varying amounts - see section.

- 5. All horses competing in Breed Classes must be registered in the relevant Breed Society. Registration papers may be requested.
- 6. Maiden and Novice Hack Classes are open to both Show Hunter and Show Hack.
- 7. Horses cannot compete in both Open Hack and Show Hunter Classes; select one or the other.
- 8. District/Local Events: Horse and rider must be domiciled within postcodes 2453, 2454, 2455).
- 9. Stallions not eligible for Hack Classes but are eligible for Ridden Breed Classes.
- 10. Maiden Horse is one that has not won first prize in the type of event nominated for at an agricultural show, rodeo, Open Championship or sports meeting.
- 11. Novice Horse is one that has not won a first prize at a Royal Show or Open Championship at an agricultural show.
- 12. Riders under 7yrs led can also compete in Rider under 7yrs unattended.
- 13. General: Only judges, Stewards and competitors in the Class being judged will be allowed in the ring. Competitors in each Class must report to the judge within three minutes of the final call for that Class. No more competitors in that Class will be admitted to the ring and judging will proceed. All competitors compete at their own risk
- 14. Ring Program: No undue delays to the ring program will be allowed. In the event of two rings clashing, competitors will be obliged to decide in which event they wish to compete.
- 15. Horse Stables are \$20 per stable, per night (Includes \$10 refundable deposit if stables are left clean). Preference will be given to travelling horses. Unused stables will be locked.
- 16. Camping Fees: \$25 per vehicle/site per night.
- 17. Where there is no competition in any Section it will rest with the Judge to decide whether exhibits are worthy to receive a prize. The word 'horse' means mare or gelding, unless otherwise stated.
- 18. Riders to appear in clean hunting and riding costume when competing.
- 19. All competitors in this and any Section of the Dorrigo Show compete entirely at their own risk. Entries are only accepted on this understanding. Signed indemnity forms need to be sighted before ring tickets are purchased at the ring office.
- 20. Safety helmets approved to Australian standards must be worn by all competitors aged 17 years and under and are recommended for all competitors in ridden events.
- 21. A 'Statement by a Supplier' is required for any person receiving more than \$50 in prize money; these forms are available at the ring and main offices and need to be signed before prize money above \$50 will be issued.
- 22. Any exhibitor not observing these rules shall render him/herself liable to the forfeiture of all prizes won by him/her.
- 23. Electric fencing is allowed on the showground under strict conditions, contact Chief Horse Steward for further details.
- 24. IT IS A CONDITION OF ENTRY THAT ALL HORSES COMPETING AT THIS SHOW COMPETE ON THE UNDERSTANDING THAT DRUG TESTING MAY BE CARRIED OUT AND IF ANY DRUGS ARE DETECTED THEN PENALTIES WILL APPLY.
- 25. Wrist bands must be worn when entering the ring. No band, no entry.
- 26. Off The Track ACT/NSW Series:

- (i) This event is open to all thoroughbreds that have officially raced or trailed either locally, nationally or internationally. All horses must be 3 years and over and over 14.2hh. All horses will have been registered with Racing Australia. Registrations will be checked.
- (ii) Racing name to be used.
- (iii) Qualifying Shows must be affiliated with Agricultural Societies Council of NSW Ltd or Show Horse Council of Australasia Inc.
- (iv) OTT qualifying Classes will be judged as a ridden Class.
- (v) Once a qualifier has been won, the horse cannot compete in other qualifiers within the season. Horses achieving Runner Up are able to continue in the competition unless they win an OTT-qualifier Class. The winner and runner up of each qualifying Class will be eligible to compete in the State Final.
- (vi) Horses will be judged as a good example of a Thoroughbred rather than riding/hunter types with the following being taken into consideration: Thoroughbred qualities-conformation, manners, paces and performance. Injuries caused through racing, such as blemishes, will be allowed.
- (vii) Judge's decision is final in qualifiers and final.
- (viii) Horse and owner must reside in ACT or NSW to compete in the Off The Track ACT/NSW Series.
- 27. Working Pattern details can be found on our website under competitions.
- 28. Competitors must have a completed Horse Health Certificate to hand in when they are entering on the day or email it to the Entries Steward along with their entries





INGREDIENTS:

250g sultanas

250g chopped raisins

250g currants

125g chopped mixed peel

90g chopped red glace cherries

90g chopped blanched almonds

1/3 cup sherry or brandy

250g plain flour

60g self-raising flour

1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/2 teaspoon ground cloves

250g butter

250g soft brown sugar

½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind

½ teaspoon almond essence

½ teaspoon vanilla essence

4 large eggs.



Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Judge Note: The height of the cake should not exceed 5.7cm (57mm)

- 4. A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
- 5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organisation.
- 6. All three article/garments must have been **completed within the 12 months prior to the local show** and made by the exhibitor/s.

COMPETITION REGULATIONS FOR COMPETITORS

NSW Demolition Derby Rules and Regulations

1. Introduction

Rules and Regulations for the Conduct of Competitions at New South Wales Agricultural Shows & Affiliated Agricultural Shows

The rules and regulations set out below are the minimum required rules to be included in organiser rules to conduct a Demolition Derby at an Agricultural Show in NSW under the AgShows NSW Insurance programme. Any additional rules must follow relevant legislation and regulations (e.g., WHS or Safework). This is necessary to improve the safety of participants and other stakeholders and encourage education, competition, and skill development.

Demolition Derbies are designed to ensure a safe and enjoyable competition for participants while delivering thrilling entertainment for spectators.

2. Definitions

Competitor:

A registered participant driving a vehicle in the Demolition Derby. Must meet age and licensing requirements, attend scrutineering and the Toolbox Talk, and comply with all vehicle and conduct rules.

Judge

The Judge is responsible for monitoring the Demolition Derby event to determine competition outcomes in accordance with the rules. This includes identifying the last mobile vehicle, ensuring fair conduct, and confirming the winner(s). The Judge's role is strictly observational and decision-based. All decisions made by the Judge regarding the outcome of the event are final and cannot be disputed.

Scrutineer

The Scrutineer is responsible for inspecting all vehicles and ensuring they meet the safety and compliance standards outlined in the official rules. The Scrutineer has the authority to approve or reject any vehicle or driver they deem unsafe or non-compliant. They will also conduct the mandatory Toolbox Talk, which all drivers and pit crew must attend. The Scrutineer's decisions are final, and no protests or appeals will be accepted.

To maintain fairness and accountability, the roles of Judge and Scrutineer must be performed by separate individuals

Marshal:

An official positioned around the ring or entry/exit points to manage safety, enforce boundaries, assist with communication, and coordinate emergency response if required.

Safety Car:

A designated emergency vehicle, such as a fire engine or response unit, positioned with visibility of the ring and ready to respond immediately to fire, rollover, or medical incidents. May also be referred to as the Control Car.

- 5. Compliance and Agreement
 - Entry Form, Waiver and Code of Conduct

1. Driver Safety Requirements

- 1.1 Full-faced helmet with visor or goggles must be worn.
- 1.2 Neck Brace must be worn SFI Foam collar to be used.
- 1.3 One-piece driving suit or one-piece cotton drill overalls to be worn with covered footwear. No synthetic or nylon clothing allowed. No exposed skin allowed. All drivers must wear full-length, long-sleeved overalls. Leather gloves, boots or shoes must be worn. NO THONGS or SNEAKERS. NO NYLON CLOTHING.
- 1.4 Gloves of fire-retardant material to be worn.

2. Minimum Age

2.1 All drivers must be 17 years or over and hold a current driver's licence – P Plate minimum. Parent or legal guardian must complete and sign the waiver for all participants under 18 years.

3. Drugs and Alcohol

3.1 Drivers under the influence of alcohol or drugs will not be permitted to compete. Random drug and alcohol testing may be conducted before the event begins, and drivers must return a 0.0 or negative test result.

4. Vehicle Requirements

4.1 Vehicle Security and Safety

- 4.1.1 No obscene or offensive sign writing on cars.
- 4.1.2 The driver's name must be displayed on the right-hand side of the roof (150mm).
- 4.1.3 Strictly NO passengers will be permitted to travel in the vehicle.
- 4.1.4 Padding to be placed on all bar work and protrusions to protect the driver.
- 4.1.5 Centre of steering wheel to be padded, with airbags disconnected and removed.
- 4.1.6 Driver's side door to be painted white or red with the opposite colour painted in a cross on the door.
- 4.1.7 All doors and tailgate to be chained shut around door pillars using 6mm chain and bolted using 10mm bolts. Chain to go twice around door pillars and be bolted. Both front doors to be securely chained (6mm), bolted or welded shut.
- 4.1.8 If the vehicle has a tailgate, it must be chained closed with 6mm chain and bolted using 10mm bolts but must be accessible for scrutineering.
- 4.1.9 Battery to be securely mounted and covered with rubber matting.
- 4.1.10 Effective kill switch to be mounted in the centre cowl panel & marked in contrasting colours "KILL SWITCH."
- 4.1.11 All wires to be suitably grommeted where they pass through the firewall.
- 4.1.12 Wires not to be attached to fuel lines.
- 4.1.13 All cars are to be cleaned out (no loose objects).

4.2 Vehicle Eligibility

- 4.2.1 All competing vehicles must be sedans, station wagons, panel vans, or utilities of average sedan size.
- 4.2.2 Full-chassis vehicles, defined as those where the chassis can be unbolted or separated from the body for the full length of the vehicle, are strictly prohibited.
- 4.2.3 Four-wheel drive vehicles are not permitted, and all-wheel drive vehicles must have their four-wheel drive system disconnected to operate as two-wheel drive.
- 4.2.4 Only original manufacturer body panels and equipment must be used in their entirety.
- 4.2.5 Special dispensation MUST be sought from the insurer for the inclusion of V8-powered vehicles.

4.3 Vehicle Modifications

- 4.3.1 Vehicle must use the original type manufacturer engine and transmission mounted in the original position.
- 4.3.2 The vehicle must be retained at its original height, i.e., no alteration to the suspension.
- 4.3.3 All holes in the firewall and front floor are to be covered.
- 4.3.4 Tow bars and bull bars to be removed.
- 4.3.5 All glass must be removed.
- 4.3.6 All interior linings, trims, interior/exterior door handles, glovebox lid, airbags, ornaments, chrome strips, and lights to be removed.
- 4.3.7 Dashboard (dashboard plastic) should remain in place as well as an interior rear-vision mirror.
- 4.3.8 Steel mesh must be welded on the driver's half windscreen.
- 4.3.9 A seat incorporating a headrest must be used.
- 4.3.10 All drivers are to wear a seat belt. Seat belts must be in good condition. The vehicle must not contain rust in either the seat or seat belt mountings.
- 4.3.11 Driver Safety Bars Mandatory

No other internal or external bar work or reinforcement is allowed except for the two bars below, which are required:

- 1. A horizontal bar running from B pillar to B pillar (side to side) that supports the driver's seat.
- 2. A vertical bar running from the floor to the roof, positioned just behind the driver's seat
 and as close to the horizontal bar as possible. It must allow the driver's headrest to be
 properly fitted and secured.

Specifications for both bars:

- Minimum size: 50x50mm, 5mm thick RHS steel
- Ends must have 6mm thick steel plates
- Must be bolted in with at least 2 x 12mm (½ inch) bolts per end, using heavy-duty washers

Note: If using galvanised steel, it must be ground and prepped before welding.

4.3.12 Driver's Door Bracing - Mandatory

One of the following options must be used:

- a. Steel Plate:
 - Minimum 6mm thick steel plate
 - Must span at least the full width of the window if installed inside the door, or beyond the length of the door if installed externally
 - o Must be welded or bolted on securely

OR

- b. RHS Bar Option:
 - Use two horizontal RHS steel bars, minimum size 40x40mm and 5mm thick
 - o Bars must be 300-400mm apart
 - o The bottom bar must sit roughly at hip height
 - Bars must be welded securely
- 4.3.13 The driver's door must be in good condition and approved by officials as safe.
- 4.3.14 The driver's door may be fully welded and/or chained closed.
- 4.3.15 Any sharp edges near the driver must be removed
- 4.3.16 Padding to be placed on all bar work and protrusions to protect driver.

4.4 Fuel and Fire Safety

- 4.4.1 An approved boat fuel tank or Jerry can with a breather must be fastened in the centre rear in a cradle, where the back seat was.
- 4.4.2 Fire extinguishers are allowed but must be securely mounted with a steel bracket.
- 4.4.4 The vehicle's petrol tank must be removed or punctured with a minimum 12mm hole.
- 4.4.5 A maximum of five (5) litres of petrol in the fuel tank is permitted.

4.5 Wheels and Tyres

4.5.1 Front wheel drive cars must only have standard car tyres. Where possible, standard car tyres should be used. At the show's discretion whether winter tread or rally type tyres are permitted. Strictly NO tractor tyres, racing rims or racing tyres permitted.

4.6 Surrender Flag

4.6.1 Each vehicle must have a white surrender flag (minimum size 30cm x 30cm) securely attached to a piece of dowel. The flag must be mounted above the driver's door in a location easily accessible to the driver. To indicate surrender or withdrawal from the event, the driver must snap the flag off.

All vehicles must have their surrender flag flying before the derby commences.

This document, together with the Show Society Code of Conduct and the AgShows NSW Waiver Form, constitutes the official rules and guidelines governing Demolition Derby competitions held at NSW Agricultural Shows.

Compliance with these requirements is mandatory for all participants. By signing the official entry form, each entrant (including competitors, exhibitors, and drivers) acknowledges and agrees to abide by all rules, regulations, terms and conditions of entry, and the Code of Conduct.

OVERVIEW

The Cattle Health Declaration is a legal document. Please complete accurately before signing.

Cattle Heath Declarations are a way for producers to provide information about the health status of the cattle they are selling. Buyers should ask vendors for a Declaration and use the information provided to determine the health risks associated with the animals on offer

Some states/territories require testing or certification additional to that outlined in this document e.g. Johne's disease (JD) in WA and for Enzootic Bovine Leucosis (EBL) in Tasmania. Please check the entry requirements for any interstate movements at:

www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/what-we-do/endemic-disease/livestock-movements

The original of this form is to be attached to the National Vendor Declaration (NVD) form accompanying the cattle, if applicable. A duplicate remains with the vendor; it is recommended the vendor retains a copy of this declaration for seven (7) years.

QUESTIONS 3 & 4: BOVINE VIRAL DIARRHOEA VIRUS (PESTIVIRUS) TESTING

Persistently infected animals can be detected by conducting a pestivirus antigen test. This test only needs to be conducted once in an animal's life. Cattle that test positive in most cases are persistently infected animals. Pestivirus antibody testing may be done to check the pestivirus status of the herd. Dairy cattle may be tested through bulk milk testing. Contact your veterinarian for assistance. Producers who don't know the answer to these questions should tick the 'N' box.

QUESTION 5: JOHNE'S DISEASE TESTING

Note: JD is a notifiable disease, so it is important to answer these questions.

Check test — testing of 50 adult animals in the herd (or all eligible animals in a herd if less than 50 adult animals) biased to increase the probability of detecting infection, tested by (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR. An ELISA test is available but is not recommended and also not accepted for entry of cattle to WA.

Sample test – screening of the adult herd or a large representative sample of the adult herd by an approved test (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR. See note above for ELISA test.

Herd Environmental Culture (HEC) Check Test (for dairy cattle) — a test of a representative sample of faecal material from the yard (see JD in Cattle Definitions & Guidelines for details). Details are available at www.animalhealthoustralia.com.au/jd-cattle-tools.

QUESTIONS 6 & 7: JOHNE'S DISEASE

Occurrence of JD refers to clinical disease in the herd or on the property(s). Clinical disease is an infected animal with chronic diarrhoea and weight-loss that does not respond to treatment.

The Johne's Beef Assurance Score (J-BAS) is a voluntary tool developed for JD risk profiling. Details are available at www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/jd-cattle-tools. The J-BAS is an initial guide and purchasers should ask for more information about JD in the origin herd (see the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Checklist on the 'JD in cattle' webpage). The National Farm Biosecurity Reference Manual - Grazing Livestock Production provides a template to use for the property biosecurity plan. All plans should include the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Plan Checklist

The Johne's Disease Dairy Score (JDDS) is a voluntary tool for JD risk profiling in dairy cattle. Information is available at www.dairyaustralia.com.au/bjd

Grazing of non-bovine species – Buyers of cattle from this consignment may consider the grazing of other JD-susceptible species (sheep, goats, alpacas) on the source property as important to their risk-management decisions. These buyers are entitled to seek information on how you have managed disease risks for all your livestock.

TREATMENTS & VACCINATIONS

Provide details on any cattle treatments in the last six (6) months and vaccinations within the last twelve (12) months.

Some manufacturers include more than one of the categories listed in the same vaccine, known as a combination vaccine. If you use a combination vaccine, each agent(s), as appropriate, should be detailed.

For vaccinations to be current, you must have followed the manufacturer's recommendation for vaccination. Typically, young animals or first time vaccinated animals need two (2) doses, followed by annual boosters. As variations to this general rule do occur (e.g. Silirum is given once only), you must use the manufacturer's recommendations.


